It is important to familiarize yourself with all of the governing documents and to ask questions as they arise. Our bylaws clearly state that CV2 must be your primary address, you must live on site for six months of the year. If you wish to serve as a trustee, the bylaws require you to live on site for ten months of the year. This is to ensure that everyone is invested in the life and livelihood of this village.

Come out to the monthly open board meetings to learn what is going on in your village and to ask questions. In an effort to make attendance at board meetings easier for all of our residents to get to we will begin this month to have one meeting a quarter in the evening. The May open board meeting will take place on May 5th at 6PM in Harmony Hall, come

out and join us.

I hope you are looking forward to the many activities available to you here at CV2 and in our Manchester community throughout the summer months. Whether it is a rousing bocci ball game, a hard fought corn hole game, a quiet nature walk, an evening at a concert at Harry Wright Lake plan now to do something fun this summer. Fun activities and spending time socializing with friends and neighbors will help us stay young and vibrant,

Reminders and Updates

Spring Home Maintenance Checklist - 🌸 Clean AC filters 🌸 Change batteries on smoke & carbon monoxide detectors 🌸 Check window frames for winter damage 🌸 Check water heater for any leaks or corrosion 🌸 Clean the clothes dryer exhaust duct and space under the dryer 🌸 Check outdoor faucets and hoses for leaks 🌸 Check that outlets, fuse boxes and extension cords are not overloaded 🌸 Make sure your fire extinguisher is in good condition at least once a year 🌸 Check all lightbulbs in fixtures & make sure they are the correct wattage 🌸 Clean ceiling fans & change the rotation. In the spring/summer fans should rotate counterclockwise and, in the fall/winter, clockwise.

Mulch - N.J.A.C. 5:70-3, 305.6 Landscape materials -As previously shared, the use of combustible landscape materials, such as wood-based mulch products, is prohibited in any of the following conditions: 1. Within 18 inches of any building or structure; 2. Within 18 inches of a deck, porch, balcony, or any other portion of the building constructed of combustible material; or 3. Within 18 inches of any designated smoking area defined in Section 310.2..

Rubber mulch or organic mushroom mulch are permitted. Failure to comply is subject to fines by CVII as well as the Fire Marshall.

Feeding Wildlife is Prohibited - Feeding leads to public health concerns. Too many animals in one place increases the chance of disease transmission to people and among other wildlife. Animals accustomed to people often lose their fear of people and can become aggressive. Those that become too aggressive may have to be destroyed to protect people and property.

Sprinkler Heads – Sprinkler heads are not covered the association nor the landscape company. If you see a sprinkler head above ground, please push it down to avoid damage.

Guest Parking Tags – Quads, Multiplexes, Eightplexes - Guest parking tag must be placed on the rear-view mirror rod whenever the vehicle associated with your unit is parked in a stall designated for a guest. Please contact the office, via email or phone, to schedule a time to pick up your parking tag. In the event the tag is lost, the replacement cost is \$20.00. Please note, as single units and duplexes have two assigned parking spaces, the tags are available to certificate holders of Quads, Multiplexes, and Eightplexes only.

Outdoor Grills – Grill must be stored in the (3) three-foot areas or on patios only. Please ensure the grills are (5) feet away from any combustible building or surface.

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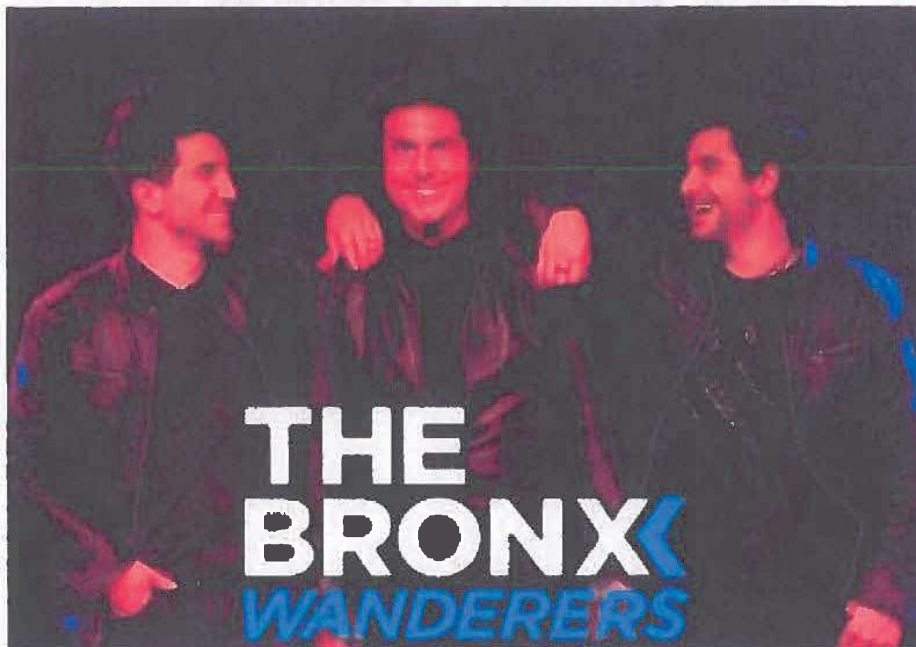

Open Board Meeting of April 7, 2025

The meeting was called to order by Marian D'Alessandro, President at 10:05 AM.
She led us in the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

Secretary's Report: Marian read the minutes of the last open meeting of March 3 and asked for a motion to approve. So moved by Linda and seconded by Mike. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Our auditor, Gerwin Bauer of Maher Elliot Bauer and Gas reported on the CV2 audit of financial statements as of June 30, 2024.

- An auditor checks for internal controls, compliance with laws, etc. No theft, fraud, or mismanagement was found.
- After expenses, there was a surplus of \$4K, which was moved to the Replacement Fund. This is less than usual, due to the higher than anticipated Real Estate tax increase.
- The Replacement Fund increased \$576K to \$4,183K at year end. Due to new laws, it was recommended that the Reserve Fund be reviewed and updated, and this has been done by the Board. CV2 is ahead of most other CV villages in preparing for structural repairs and crawlspace issues.

A motion to approve the audit was made by Mike, seconded by Candy, and approved.

President's Report: Marian reported that she has met with trustees of the other three CV co-ops in an effort to bring down costs. First on the agenda is how to share the bus expenses. She asked the membership for suggestions.

- Trees: A study has identified those trees that need to be removed in addition to the yearly \$50K budget. An additional \$55K is needed. Joe is making a three year plan to proceed.
- Evening Meeting: we will try to have an open meeting once a quarter in the evening to accommodate shareholders who are still working. The May meeting will be at

6PM. If it doesn't seem to bring in more shareholders, we may revert to the daytime schedule.

- The Semi-Annual meeting will be April 21.
- Budget: we may need to extend the current budget through September, because we will not have the updated Real Estate tax rates in time for July.
- Electric bills: We all have experienced higher bills, and the rates will increase in June. Marian suggested that stand-alone houses run appliances during off-peak hours. Duplex and Quad shareholders might talk to their roof neighbors about doing the same.
- We are moving forward on behavioral issues in the village.
- Please remember to remove wood mulch from within 18 inches of your foundation. Alternatives are stone, rubber, or mushroom mulch.
- You may plant in the three-foot area around your unit. If you wish to plant outside that, on the common ground, you must have approval. The Board expects to approve fewer requests, because the plantings add to landscaping costs.

Treasurer's Report: Candice reported that the total monies in the Operating Account as of March 31 was \$626,295. The total in the Reserves was \$4,045,000. A motion to accept the check register was made by Janet, seconded by Joe, and approved.

Office Manager Report: Mariaellen reminded us that seemingly healthy trees can fall over. There should be no trees planted within the three-foot area around your unit.

Linda moved to approve, seconded by Mike. All requests were approved.

Contracting services for 50 Hudson to repair girders and joists by Hale Built - Candy moved to approve, seconded by Janet, approved.

Linda reported as club liaison: activities have been well attended. Upcoming are a flea market, dances, health fair, and a celebration of our 55th anniversary in November. Volunteers would be appreciated.

Gail Apgar reported on the MCC meeting in Village 5 on March 24.

- Dial-a-ride is now run by Ocean County, no longer from Cares
- Somebody Cares is being re-done, there are plans to have an attorney on site once a week, to have a food pantry, computer lab, check-ins for shut-ins. It will serve all of Manchester, hoping to help with meal delivery, help with utility shut-off notices and bills, and to have NJ mental health on site. A Café from 10-2 is available.
- There are many parks to visit in Ocean County offering events and history.
- Ongoing work to bring down utility bills.
- See more information in the Sun.

A motion to adjourn was made by Janet and seconded by Linda. The meeting adjourned at 11:05 AM.

Open Forum

- Bingo: Alice Walz presented a check for \$15K to the Village.
- 15 Bowie: there is a lot of trash where Columbus Avenue meets Bowie. A: This is JCPL property, we will remind JCPL to clean up.
- 6 Potomac: the new bus schedule that includes a trip to the mall is appreciated, but there is a question about the stated drop off times. A: We will ask Stout for clarification.
- 5 Swift Circle: Suggested that the bus pick up riders at the clubhouses so we can share with other villages, and find more interesting places to go. A: all suggestions are welcome.
- 14 Hancock: There is a big tree between houses, which is healthy and beautiful, but the roots stick up 8 inches from the ground. A: We will have the tree company look at it to see what can be done.
- 5 Conestoga: There are 3 small dead cherry trees at the side of Mallard Pond, plus a deer carcass off Schoolhouse in the trees. A: We will have Stanley look at removing the trees. For animal carcass, the deer removal number should be called.
- Gail Apgar reminded us that the poetry social will be the day before Good Friday.

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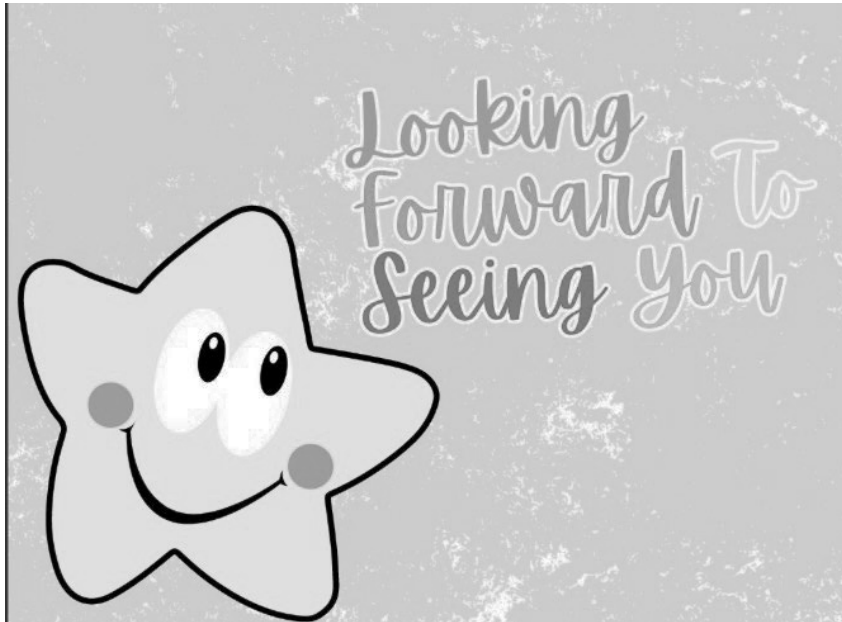

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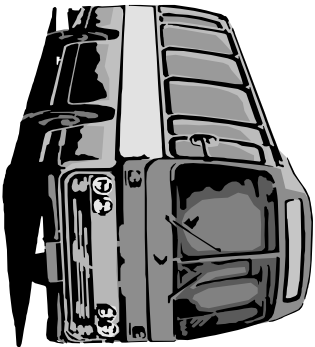
